An early intervention program for children aged 0-6 with developmental/behavioural/at-risk issues. Children attending a licensed Child Care program or Early Years program are eligible for this service. Referrals are accepted from families. children's programs, and any community agency within the District of Parry Sound, Resource Teachers provide ongoing screening and education to all persons involved with the child. Families are provided with the information and skills to choose programs and services to meet their child's needs. Resource Teachers will assist in the child's transition to school and provide assistance in obtaining funding.

Infant and Child Development Services provide home visiting, developmental assessments, and service coordination to families of infants and young children (0-6 years) with developmental concerns.

Development Support Services serve adults and children with cognitive disabilities.

Autism Intervention Programs

- Intensive Behaviour Intervention (IBI) provides centrebased, intensive behaviour therapy (20 to 35 hours/week) to children under 18 diagnosed with moderate to severe autism in order to prepare for learning opportunities.
- Behaviour Communication Therapy uses Applied Behavioural Analysis (ABA) to provide in-home therapy and consultation for children/vouth diagnosed with Autism.

Children's Mental Health provides assistance to children from 0-18 with mental health, emotional and/or significant behavioural difficulties, and their families, including:

- Treatment Intervention Preschool to Six (T.I.P.S.) Program, providing home-/community-based services for children under 6 years and their families when less intensive measures do not adequately meet family needs.

Great Beginnings Programs Prenatal Nutrition Program provides prenatal and postnatal support; Growing Up Program provides a place for parents of children 0-6 to play and get information (free transportation provided).

Early Literacy Specialist supports parents and professionals on how to effectively develop early literacy skills in children 0-6.

The NECCAC coordinates nursing, personal support. physiotherapy, occupational therapy, dietetics, and speech language therapy for eligible infants and children and determines eligibility for Enhanced Respite funding.

Children In Need Of Treatment (CINOT) is a dental program for children 17 and under who need financial assistance to obtain emergency or urgent dental treatment. Call ext. 2328.

Healthy Smiles Ontario (HSO) is a program for children 17 and under who do not have access to any form of dental coverage and who meet the income eligibility requirements. If eligible, children will get regular dental services (check-ups, fillings, x-rays and more) at no cost. For more information about eligibility criteria call ext. 2328.

Dental Clinic The health unit dental clinic, located in North Bay, provides dental care for children 17 and under if they qualify for CINOT and Healthy Smiles Ontario. Children 17 and under whose families receive social assistance support, disability income support, or have Non-Insured Health Benefits for First Nations people can also access a full range of dental services at the clinic. Call ext. 2468.

Healthy Babies, Healthy Children Program is a homevisiting program provided for pregnant moms, dads, and families with children who are six years of age and under. It is designed to help families promote healthy child development and help families reach their full potential.

Speech & Language Therapy assists children in achieving their optimum potential in the areas of speech, language, communication, cognition and swallowing. Service is available until the child enters SK, at which time the child is transitioned to school-based services.

Occupational Therapy supports children and youth to function at their best in activities of daily living (i.e. hygiene, feeding, dressing and writing). Service is available until the child enters SK, at which time the child is transitioned to school-based services.

Physiotherapy Physiotherapists work with children to enhance mobility, improve physical function and positioning, and utilize adaptive equipment . Service is available until the child enters SK, at which time the child is transitioned to school-based services.

Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA) Services and Supports provide support to children and youth to 18 with a diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder. Services target the development of specific skills through treatment and consultation in the areas of communication, social/ interpersonal, daily living, and behaviour management/ emotional regulation.

One Kids Place also offers a number of **Specialty Clinics** to children 0-18 years of age, including Seating and Mobility, Orthotics, Augmentative and Alternative Communication. Developmental Clinic. and Swallowing and Feeding Clinic.

Vision Services

The Blind Low Vision Early Intervention Program provides assessment and intervention services through an Early Childhood Vision Consultant for infants and preschool children who are Blind or Low Vision as diagnosed by an ophthalmologist. Both Child and Family Intervention Services and Childcare Consultation are available. Additionally, the program provides a Family Support Worker to the families of eligible children where indicated. This is a community-based program offering child intervention services in the environment most appropriate to the needs of the child.

The Infant Hearing Program provides specialized infant audiological assessment services to babies requiring follow-up, based on newborn screening results, and monitors high risk infants for progressive hearing loss. Ongoing Audiology and Communication Development Services are available to infants and preschool children diagnosed with Permanent Hearing Loss who meet the eligibility criteria. Family Support to provide assistance with issues related to hearing loss is available. the hearing loss is available. Children past the newborn screening age with newly identified risk factors or confirmed hearing loss may be referred.
